07 MEDICAL OPERATIONS AGAINST WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION FOR DOCTOR'S

he World security situation in the present scenario has been very volatile and fast changing especially in the Middle East region and in our neighbourhood. Additionally, the vulnerability of Indian people against Natural and Technological disasters has been expanding with rising population and Economic growth. The Medical Health resources within the Country are not only inadequate but also lack awareness on responding to the future risks arising out of the fast developing hazards in the vicinity of Population Centers. Invariably, a threat from use of Weapons of Mass Destruction by terrorists to make an impact on the people of our Country Psychologically and exhibit a token of victory can not be over sighted. This calls of unified effort on part of all Emergency Response Services to prepare and exercise capacities necessary for building resilience against such catastrophic events.

All over the World, disasters are not merely considered local problems but viewed with a wider significance as they offer an important opportunity to learn the goodness of preparedness between society, technology and environment. Optimal use of such opportunities will be very necessary to modify the way we think about medical operations during any disaster.

The National Civil Defence College, Nagpur, the first Disaster Management Institute of Government of India will be organizing 7th Medical Operations against WMD for Doctor's, a two weeks Program from 13-24 September 2010. The Program has been designed to prepare Medical Officers to deal with Mass Casualty situations arising out of terrorist event involving Weapons of Mass Destruction. However, the contents of the Training Program also cover Medical Operations during any disaster, Biological Epidemics, Industrial Disasters as well as dealing with any Mass Casualty situations. The State Health Authorities should take utmost advantage of this opportunity for training their Medical Officers in this Training Program which will involve hands on skill oriented exercises.
